92. Serendip Sanctuary - Saturday 28 October 2006
A select group of GEMS enjoyed a pleasant day at Serendip, despite the weather. Alas, there was very little water in the lake, but lots of birds.
93. AGM 2006 - 3 December 2006
A good attendance and a fine meal. An enjoyable GEMS social event.
94. Disc Bowls - 1 January 2007
A good turn out with 15 contestants. Perfect weather (overcast but no rain). Hard fought matches with Steve Nichols winning the Singles and John and Bev Huntley winning the Doubles. The 2006 raffle was drawn with a long list of prizes won, details are on the web site (Statistics/Raffle Results) and will be reported at the next AGM.
FUTURE EVENTS (event numbers and dates may have changed)
95. Music For The People - 25 February 2007 (11am to 4:30pm in 2006)
An annual open air concert for nearly 40 years, held in a sound shell at Mossvale Park in Gippsland. Admission in 2006 was \$10 adult, \$8 concession and children under 15 free. Mossvale Park is 15km from Leongatha towards Mirboo North on the Strzlecki Highway (see map). The Park is very pleasant with wide grassed areas and plenty of trees. BYO tucker and chairs. This is an all day event featuring a main attraction in the afternoon (last year it was the Victorian Concert Orchestra) and several local groups in the morning. One of the morning groups will be (for the third successive year) the Browns Cows Orchestra (Rob is in the percussion section).
GRADE - Sedentary.
Accommodation is available in Inverloch for anyone wishing to come down on Saturday.
96. Tasmania - 2-4 (or 7) March 2007 (expressions of interest to see if this is viable).

Cross the Tasman for a weekend (or a few more days) overseas with GEMS. There will be a loud beanie competition.

One way single boat fares -

Day boat \$85 (summer sale special, normally \$114).

Night boat - cruise seats \$101-\$130, cabins from \$162.

Alternative would be to fly there and/or back (from \$55 Jetstar one way, depends on times of flights, from \$69 at weekends).

We could hire a minibus (about \$45 per person for 6 people sharing a 12 seater bus for 2 days, plus all petrol and any extra km charges, cheaper with more people).

Caravan park en-suite cabins are about \$90 per night for two people, \$10-\$15 per extra person up to 6 per cabin. On site vans are about \$50-\$70 per night for 2 people.

Possible scenarios -

Group A travels by boat in the daytime (Friday) to Devonport.

Group B travels by boat at night (Friday) to Devonport.

Group C flies to Launceston Friday night.

Groups A, B and C combine and travel by minibus to north coast tourist traps on Saturday and Sunday.

Some Members fly back from Launceston or return by boat from Devonport Sunday night.

Others continue minibus tours over 1-3 extra days (individual choices, to be negotiated).

Fly or boat back in daylight or at night time as above.

Total travel and accommodation cost for 2 people is expected to be less than \$600 for 2 days (food, souvenirs, admission fees etc. extra).

There will be a meeting to discuss the detailed itinerary if there is sufficient interest.
